

Forwarded herewith is a photograph showing an elliptical shaped light. The photo was made at night from the top of a building in Modesto, California. The camera was oriented towards the East and was left unattended for four hours except for opening and closing the shutter. A civil defense ground observer crew noted an aircraft with a landing light on fly the traffic pattern at Modesto Airport several times during the interval that the exposure was made. It is the opinion of the Preparing Officer that the elliptical light on the photo negative is the result of the flash of an aircraft landing light.



3. Comments of Preparing Officer: It is the opinion of the preparing officer that the elliptical light in the photograph is the flash of a landing light of an aircraft flying in the vicinity of Modesto Airport. This conclusion is based on statements of observers and the coincidence of the northwest orientation of the runway and its location. The runway was $4\frac{1}{2}NM$ from the observers and $2\frac{1}{2}NM$ from the camera. See map, Inclosure 2.
