## MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD:

1. Long-distance telephone conversation between Lt. Davenport, Lowry AFB and Lt. Machyowsky at this Headquarters.
2. Lt. Machyowsky stated that he had received information that Lt. Davenport had taken intercept action on the UFOB sighted over Denver, Colorado, 13/0515Z August 1956.
3. Lt. Davenport stated that was correct and that he had identified the objects as two balloons.
4. Lt. Machyowsky questioned Lt. Davenport concerning further details of the intercept action for identification.
5. Lt. Davenport after relating the details stated that there was no doubt whatsoever that the objects were balloons.
