

REPORT OF OBSERVATION OF UNIDENTIFIED FLYING OBJECT

OBSERVER'S POSITION: at a window on the west side of the second floor of Hall on College Campus

OBSERVER'S IDENTIFICATION:

I am an Assistant Professor of Art at College. I have been teaching here since September 1948.

, age 32 years

During World War II I served as an Ensign (navigation and gunnery) on an L S T in the Pacific.

My Naval training included sixty hours of flight training as a Naval Aviation Cadet. I was declared physically unqualified for further flight training after an operation on my knee.

Upon completion of Columbia Midshipmans School I was commissioned and further trained as an aircraft identification officer at Gulfport, Mississippi.

I am now a member of the Naval Reserve Research Company with the rank of LTJG.

OBSERVATIONS: see appended sketches

The sky was a solid slate gray with a solid darker gray cloud bank showing above the coast range to the west.

When I first observed the object it appeared as a short, diagonal, white line and seemed to be stationary in the sky.

The object's position was due west from Hall. Its ang elevation was approximately 30 degrees.

As I watched, it changed its direction from diagonal to horizontal with a just barely perceptable speed. There was no horizontal or verticle movement, only a change in direction of the long axis of the shape from diagonal to horizontal. While this change of direction was taking place, there was also a change in shape taking place from a relatively long thin line to a shorter fatter shape that was thicker in the middle than at the ends.

After it reached the horizontal position it continued to be motionless for some minutes. It was motionless in respect to horizontal or verticle movement, but a "ripple" or a "flutter" passed over the shape periodically all the time it was under observation.

After eight minutes (by my watch) the north end of the shape began to bend down. The whole shape did not tilt, it bent. After the north end had bent down as far as approximately on-third of the whole length, it (the north end) began to curl back under the shape. By continuing this bending, the thing reversed itself completely so that what had been the north end was now the sourth end.

During this process of reversing its ends I observed two changes in its appearance. First the over-all color of the shape began changing from an intense white to a very slight pink tint. And there appeared on what was originally the north end of the shape a dark spot. This spot was not black nor was it very sharply defined. This "tip" was, however, perceptably darker than the rest of the shape.

After the "turn" or "reversal of ends" was completed, the shape continued to move toward the south. As it moved (in a horizontal position and in a horizontal direction) toward the south, the dark tip remained visable and the over-all color became increasingly redder and increasingly transparent until it was no longer discernable.

REMARKS: The distance covered from the time the shape turned until it faded out was an estimated 20 degrees.

I opened the window that I was looking through to make sure that the flutter I observed was not due to wrinkles in the glass. The flutters continued.

I was aware of no sound that could be attributed to the shape. There was no trail of smoke or vapor behind the shape.

The time from when I first observed it until it began to turn was eight minutes. From the beginning of the turn until it was no longer visable was four minutes. Total observation: twelve minutes.


At no time was there any indication of great speed (in reference to the horizon). It took an estimated thirty to sixty seconds to turn, and the remaining part of the four minutes to travel the estimated twenty degrees of arc and fade out.

In view of the fact that I am a practicing professional painter and a professor of painting, I consider my self a competant observer and recorder of visual phenomena.

This report was written on 23 November 1954 at the request of Col.




SKETCH NUMBER ONE

SKETCH NUMBER TWO


This is the position the shape assumed and kept during the first eight minutes of watching.

The shape begins to show a pinkness in color and also the dark spot at the leading tip.

This sketch indicates the maximum degree of pinkness the shape attained after it had moved toward the south for a few minutes and had begun to fade out.

A dark tip appeared on the original north end of the object and remained visible through 20 degrees of horizontal distance before the object disappeared. It took from three (3) to three and one half (3½) minutes to travel this 20 degree are.
