Visual from Trans Canada 428 (DC-3) 7000 ft. heading 110° magnetic 4. Sighting 0112Z, 11 March 1955 (night) 5. HKJA 4038 6. Capt. Emire, Trans Canada Airlines, Canada 7. Observers weather report not obtainable. Report from Dow Air Force Base Weather Station is as follows: Millinockett: partly obscured visability 6 miles in haze, temperature 35°, dew point 22, winds south at 5 knots, altimeter 995. With no thunder storms or turbulence at this point being reported. 8. Unknown 9. Diverted Super Duper "22" (F-89D) from Presque Isle Air Force Base, Maine. Could not locate or sight any unusual object. 10. No aerial activity in the area at that time. 11. Joseph H. Byrne, Intelligence Officer			
REMARKS: At the time of ██████████ 's report this station called The Ground Observer Corp Filter Center at Bangor. They called their observer post in that area HKGA 3931 nearest ██████████ 's sightings. Hazel Smart was the observer on duty. She stated that she observed a red, yellow and green light, complete with tail disappear into the horizon as if falling. At the same position, Hazel Smart may be contacted by phoning Winn 7-41 Mattawankeag.
