We had been sitting on my friends porch when I noticed two
objects moving in a straight line. I thought that they were
jet fighters but when I heard no sound I mentioned it to my
friends. We watched for a second and then realized that they
were not and type of commercial aircraft or military plane. We
sort of got excited but after we calmed down, I determined their
direction, speed, and altitude and noticed the time. Right after
we sighted the first object, I saw another one traveling to the

left of the first ~~one~~. It was matching the first in speed and both were of the same shape and at the same altitude. It was about $\frac{3}{4}$ to $1\frac{1}{4}$ miles to the left of the first. Then I noticed that neither object had made the faintest noise. All the stars were out that night and there were no clouds. The only ~~star~~ color the two objects had was that of the reflection of the moon. This letter and the one that I wrote to Washington D.C. are not jokes. They describe exactly what I saw and I hope that by this that I am helping in the defense of the U.S.
