A little after six o'clock MST, on 18 Jan 1955 Mr. was walking Through his back yard when suddenly he saw a bright flash from overhead. The surroundering ground was lit up with a violet color. Mr. saw a teardrop shaped object with a very small trail behind it. The movement was to the S.W. at a very high rate of speed. Some two to five minutes passed before he heard any sound and then the sound was a loud booming explosion. However the sound did not come from directly overhead but from a sourthernly direction.
