III. SOURCE'S DESCRIPTION OF SIGHTING: The unidentified object was vaguely round and varied in size from a half dollar held at arms length to a penny held the same way. It howered, moving slowly downward for about 5 minutes at which time it appeared as a red pulsating glow. After a while it gained altitude, circled in a short turn, about one twentieth of the sky and then disappeared to the East.
