





This object was sighted about 7:50 p.m. on Nov. 2, 1955; this date could be in error one day as I did not note the date after reporting the sighting and thought little more about it. I had walked out on my front porch for a breath of fresh air and was setting on the steps when I looked up for the big dipper; the dipper wasn't up and the moon was low in the East. I glanced at Polaris and as I looked away, I saw a light moving and started watching it thinking monentarily it was a plane until the light changed from white to blue then to purple rapidly; this change in color coupled with increased momentum from due North horizontally to the West convinced me it was not a plane. At this point I called my wife; I called her three times quickly. She came immediately and I told her to look up and pointed to the approximate position of the object and she readily picked it up and we watched it continue Westward until it was almost due West which was a matter of possibly one and one-half to two minutes; during this time it continued to change colors. When it reached the West, it stopped momentarily seeming to move in several different directions within a small radius then began to accend vertically very fast. It appeared to be moving vertically and away from us. With the object still in sight, I went inside and called the Duty Officer at Naval Air Station Corpus Christi with the intention of giving the location for additional witnesses; not to report a UFO. I was answering questions for several minutes on the phone and when I returned to the porch, my wife contended she could still see the object, however, I did not.

Any judge of the speed, altitude or distance of the object from my position would not be very accurate; the angles and directions are.
