REPORT ON UNIDENTIFIED FLYING OBJECTS
(Sighted 1945 - 2015 on 10 April 1956)

(1) Description of the Objects:

- (a) Shape - Round lights
- (b) Size - Little larger than head of pin
- (c) Color - Star color
- (d) Number - 1945 - 1st sighting - one formation estimated from
20 to 30 objects
1955 - 2nd sighting - one formation estimated from
10 to 15 objects
2010 - 3rd sighting - 8 to 12 objects
(A similar sighting was made in March 1956, date not remembered -
about the same time in the evening of approximately 5 to 8 objects.
All the facts concerning the sightings described above apply to
this sighting in March 1956).
- (e) Formation - In all the four sightings above, the objects in
flight would vary from a horizontal line to a
vague V formation with objects changing positions
within the formations rapidly.
- (f) None
- (g) Tail, Trail or Exhaust - None visible
- (h) Sound - No sound heard
- (i) Other pertinent or unusual features: All the objects were the same
size. Estimated Altitude - over 20,000
Estimated Speeds - 500 to 1,000 or more
(These are at best rough estimates)

(2) Description of Course of Objects:

- (a) Undersigned is interested in Astronomy and whenever possible scans
the skies at night.
- (b) When first observed angle of elevation estimated at 45° and objects
azimuth was N.W.
- (c) When last observed angle of elevation estimated at 30° and objects
azimuth was N.W.
- (d) Flight Path - All formations flew the same flight path; over Pacific
Beach flying N.W., disappearing over the Pacific Ocean. All for-
mations approached from the same direction.
- (e) Flight path steady N.W. with objects changing positions in flight
rapidly.
- (f) Length of Time in Sight - Approximately 2 minutes - each formation.

- (a) Ground - Visual
- (b) No optical aids
- (c) Not applicable

- (7) (a) Weather - Fair and clear with scattered cloud formations.
- (b) Weather report from Weather Bureau not available.
- (c) Ceiling - None
- (d) Visibility - Clear
- (e) Amount of cloud cover - Patches over San Diego, none over Pacific Beach and flight path of objects over Pacific Ocean.

- (9) None
- (10) Within the period of the three sightings there were approximately 10 to 12 aircraft flying. These consisted of 4 Commercial airliners taking off and landing at Lindbergh Field. Approximately three or four single engine (piston type) in low formation altitude approximately 500 to 1000 feet West of Pacific Beach, over the ocean flying from the North to a South direction. I presumed they were Navy fighters or trainers. I believe one of these ships dropped a flare over the ocean. Also sighted were approximately 3 jets, estimated altitude from 5000 to 10,000 feet flying individually and at separate times during the period of the sightings. These 3 jets flew in many directions - although one jet did assume a N.W. position and disappeared over the ocean.
