

While on duty as a Ground Observer at the Encanto Post (11-Bravo) SanDiego County Civil Defense, on the night of 13 June 1956 between the hours of 1900 and 2200 — at the approximate hour of 2115 an unidentified flying object was sighted.

At the time I was on the outside south catwalk and was watching the sky and at the moment of sighting the object, was looking to the southwest and between some trees (see sketch below). I saw what I at first thought was a brilliant yellowish star. At the moment I thought nothing of it and looked away from it and when I looked again only a few seconds later, this object (still brilliant to the naked eye) had moved. I immediately put the binoculars on it and called to Mrs. Who was on duty with me. She came, took the binoculars and observed the object and it had moved slowly to the southeast. We decided to call it in to the filter center in Pasadena, Calif on the "hot" wire, so she went inside to report the object. I remained on the cat walk with the binoculars trained on the object. It was, as stated before, a yellowish orange, as if a plane were on fire. While she was contacting the buty Airman, I noticed through the binoculars what I took to be an explosion—exploding upward from the upper left edge of the object. The smoke trailed upward leaving a definite smoke trail, and at the end of the smoke trail was smaller lighted, seemingly solid object, appeared. The smoke trail and solid object, which seemingly appeared to be exploded from it, disappeared almost impediately.

At this time while under observation by myself, there were planes in the air and I cannot be positive of the number, but I know for sure two planes, and possibly three, flew in what appeared to be close proximity to the object, i.e., from our vantage point they flew in front of it, crossing my line of vision. One plane was crossing diagonally downward in a westerly course another was crossing directly in front of it on a level westerly course and I believe there was a third above it on an easterly course.

The object was at almost eye level with our position, except for the fact that it was some approximately 25 miles distance I would roughly estimate, and being on a tower

catwalk upon a rise in the ground and looking towards it, it was some distance from ground level over the area in which it seemed to move. I cannot judge the altitude though I believe we reported it at 2,000 ft. at the time (I am not now sure).

The distance has been estimated at 25 miles because I have judged the object to be near, or over, a Naval Installation at bay side (Destroyer Base, SanDiego).

In all the time I was observing it, it maintained the steady slow movement to the southeast — (perhaps more easterly) and while "rs. was in contact with the Duty Airman, this object was obscured from my vision by the trees and I ran down from the catwalk to try to gain a clearer vision away from the obstruction of the trees, but I did not proceed far enough and lost sight of it. I called to Mrs. who reported the loss from vision and then I ran back up on the catwalk and upon again looking at the area to my southwest, resighted it through the obstruction of the trees.

At this time I gave the glasses to Mrs. who had come outside, and I went inside to re-call the Duty Airman to report resighting. (The record shows that I contacted the Filter Center at 2320 to report resighting). Mrs. then maintained contact through binoculars for the rest of the period the object was in sight. I was unable to contact the Duty Airman as he was in Radar and I returned outside having reported to the operator at the filter center. Mrs. had now gone down from the tower and proceeded farther on the ground than I had and was able to clear the line of trees and there retained and faded completely from sight. She called to me and I again reported in to say we had lost contact. This was approximately 2127 and the Duty Airman requested me

Mrs. returned to the tower and neither of us observed the object again. In three minutes, AT 2130, I reported back to the Duty Airman as requested, at which time he took further information from me. I gave him my report which was substantially the same as given here.

I wish to note further at this time that during the last period the object was in sight, from 2120 until 2127, I no longer observed it because it was obscured completely from my vision by the trees.

Also it is conceivable that this object was deceiving (because of the distance) in its course of travel, and while it appeared to me to be traveling in a southeasterly direction, it could possibly have been moving down the Coast line toward "exico. Further it must have been quite large from the size it appeared to us at the distance viewed. I would roughly estimate that the size would be in the neighborhood of that of a B-36 or larger.

Realizing distance can be confusing, I of course can make no positive identification of the object and can only report my observations and first impressions of the matter to the best of my ability. I believe Mrs. will support the foregoing in the main.

I can think of nothing more to add, but will cooperate to the best of my ability should any further questions or report be required.

I trust this report will be of assistance in the assimilation of any further data you may have received regarding this matter.
