II. RELIABILITY: SOURCE was interviewed via telephone, however, he seems sincere and gave answers in a clear and precise manner. In view of SOURCE'S age and lack of technical background information is considered to be only fairly reliable.

III. SOURCE'S DESCRIPTION OF SIGHTING:

SOURCE stated that he first observed reported object, at 31/0230Z Jan 56, from his home in Seattle, Washington GEOREF DKNC 4035. It was completely dark and the sky was clear. SOURCE stated object was round in shape and about the size of a pencil eraser held at arms length. Object was bright and appeared to flicker like a star and appeared to change colors including white, amber, blue and green. When first observed, SOURCE stated object was southeast of his position or approximately 160° at an elevation of 15°.

Object slowly moved to 180° and elevation increased to 20° by 31/0730Z Jan 56. SOURER stated that object had been visible in approximately the same position each night since original sighting and he now believes it to be a star.

- L Dr of the University of Washington Observatory was contacted and plotted the position of known bright stars and planets which might correlate with the information received in the UFOB report. Dr eported that the stare <u>STRIUS</u> was visible and very bright during the period of this UFOB observation. The position and elevation of SIRIUS from observers position and time of observation was as follows: 31/0330% Jan 56, 16° elevation, 139° bearing, 31/0630% Jan 56, 26° elevation, 180° bearing and 31/0730% Jan 56, 26° elevation, 200° bearing. Dr stated that SIRIUS is the brightest visible fixed star with a magnitude of minus 1.6. This star is predominantly bluish white with variations.
- 2. The Seattle Filter Center was contacted and indicated they had received the original UFOB report from a Boy Scout in Seattle Wash, at 31/03AOZ Jan 56. The observer was Seattle, Washington, The scout troop reported taking compass bearings and stated the object was 120° from their position at an elevation of approximately 20°. This information was passed to the controller on duty with the 635th AC & W Sq. McChord AFB, Wash.
- The Fleet Weather office at Sand Point Naval Air Station was queried concerning balloon releases and reported the following: A large RAWINDSONDE Balloon was launched from that station (ECREST DENG 4541 at 31/0231Z Jan 56. This balloon had an ascent rate of approximately 1000 feet per minute and expanded to a diameter of 20-25 feet at maximum altitude. A train of equipment was attached to the balloon including weather instruments, parachute and one small light. From the launching place this balloon moved due south and at 31/0330Z Jan 56 was at an altitude of 58,596 feet at a position 42 miles due south of Sand Point Naval Air Station. The balloon burst at 31/0350 Jan 56 at an altitude of 88,921 feet. Balloons of this type are released from this station daily on schedules.
- 4. McChord AFB weather office reported generally clear skies during time of sighting. Winds were 010 /37 knots at 10,000 feet, 020°/44 knots at 18,000, 030%/63 knots at 23,000, 010%88 knots at 30,000 and 350 /78 knots at 34,000 feet. There were three separate temperature inversions in the area. These inversions covered the following levels: 740 Milibars 730 Milibars, 300 Milibars to 250 Milibars, 228 Milibars 213 Milibars.

Thomas, Fit leader and 2/Lt John Underwood, 318 Ftr Sq. call sign Trumpet Baker I & 2 took off at approximately 31/01/50Z Jan 56 and were diverted at 06/55Z by Mercury (GCF) to Lake Washington area in vicinity of floating bridge GECREF DKNC 1535. At 8000 feet they circled the area for approximately 6 minutes and the only thing sighted was a patch of thin haze off the east side of Lake Washington at 5000 - 6000 feet. The weather was clear in the entire area except for light haze. It was moderately dark and the moon was not up. Stars were visible and bright. GCI reported no unusual sightings to pilots and no contact was made on airborne radar. Only one aircraft was observed taking off from Sea-Tac on a south course as the F-86 Ds were leaving the area. There was no turbulance. It Thomas stated that shortly before taking off another pilot pointed out a particularly bright star in the Southeast.
