



Mrs. Eleance Science State of the Cet, Astoria, Long Island, was interviewed at 0930 hours, 23 July 1949.

People present: Lr. Wirs. Scaife and the writer.

A previous check with Mrs. employers indicate that she has held her present position with Corn Products Refining Company for 30 years and is considered a stable type of person, not prone to exaggeration or verbosity. No further check of her character or background was performed.

Report of Interview: Mrs. Preports that on the evening of 24 June 1949 she returned from work at 1830 hours and immediately started to prepare supper. She turned on the radio at the same time so as to "hear Lowell Thomas". Within a minute (estimated) of the time that the objects were sighted, a single engine "fighter type" airplane appeared from the south and was observed by Mrs. Scaife to circle the area and then disappear in a southerly direction at an estimated altitude of 1,000 feet.

Attached herewith is a slip of paper, signed by Mrs. hich was written by her within two hours following the time of her observation of the phenomenon reported.

Comments of preparing officer: The observation was made through an open window, and it is my belief that Mrs. had a clear unobstructed view of the area. There are definite points of landscape which afford an easy method of orientation. The house is so situated that there is a clear unobstructed view to a clump of trees approximately 150 years distant followed by another grove of trees which are approximately an additional 150 feet away.



1. Investigation predicated upon receipt of verbal instructions from Lt Col MATTHEW THOMPSON, A0-902812, District Commander, 13th OSI District, Offutt Air Force Base, Omaha, Mebraska, after having been informed of the incident verbally by the writer.

AT RAPID CITY, SOUTH DAKOTA

2. On 29 July 1949, Mr. Mr. City Editor for the Rapid City Journal, Rapid City, South Dakota, was interviewed and advised the writer that Subject balloon was first sighted near Deadwood, South Dakota, on approximately 24 June 1949, and at that time was approximately 5,000 feet high and appeared to be standing practically still. The person who gave the first report (name not known) described the balloon as approximately one hundred (100) feet in diameter, either white or silver in color, with what appeared to be a tail of approximately ten (10) feet in length, and had some object suspended from the under side of the balloon. Mr. In author advised that on 28 June 1949 Mr. J. Engineer for General Mills, Incorporated, of Minneapolis, Minnesota, arrived in Rapid City and stated that the balloon was one manufactured by his firm which was being used by the Navy Department for cosmic ray research, and had been released from Camp Ripley, Minnesota, the preceding week. According to Mr. Mr. Stated that Subject balloon was carrying harmless counter ray research instruments and that he would pay a five dollar (\$5.00) reward for the plastic balloon and a twenty-five dollar (\$25.00) reward for the instruments. Mr. KALISZEWSKI described the balloon as being made from plastic. 105 feet in diameter, white in color, and what was reported as being a tail was probably part of the mooring rope.

- 4. The last report on Subject balloon was received on 1 July 1949 from a Mr. Kannak, Rapid City, South Dakota, who stated that he saw the balloon very high over Rapid City at approximately 2000 hours on 30 June 1949.
- 5. Since I July 1949 an informal and unofficial report was received that the balleon had returned to the vicinity of Minnesota and had gone down and was in the hands of General Mills, Incorporated, Minneapolis, Minnesota.
