this station and residing at cornia, reported the following information concerning a peculiar aerial observation he experienced:

- a. Time object sighted: Approximately 1420 PST 15 July 1949.
- b. Direction of travel: northeast
- c. Estimated altitude of object: twice altitude which two jet propelled aircraft which were flying opposite direction at time object sighted.
- d. Estimated speed of object: greatly in excess of any jet aircraft ever observed previously by witnesses.
- e. Behavior of object: appeared as mirror reflecting light, as though wobbling. Shape of object could not be determined. Object observed only for a few seconds.
- Civilian Air Force Police, McClellan AFB.
