

3.	Place of observation: Houston Light and Power Station, (Map Coordinates) Houston, Texas
4.	Position of observer (air, car, bldg, location or - give details:) Observers were looking out of a third floor window of the power plant where they were on duty. They were looking South and watching a storm that was brewing

7.	Apparent size (compare to known object, i.e., sun, moon, thumb or fist

	Round.
	Altitude (Angle of elevation above horizon - 0° at horizon, 90° overhead): Observers estimated object around 5,000 ft above earth. Because of observers' position, 3 stories high, object was almost level with their gaze.
11.	Direction from observer (Angle clockwise from north): Object appeared from the Northeast and disappeared to Southwest, making complete straight line across horizon. Distance from observer (distance to town, bldg, etc., over which object appeared to be): Appeared to be eight to ten miles away.


