Dear Sir;

On January 2, at about 2200, Mrs [REDACTED] and I
observed what we believe to be one of the "Flying Saucers".

It was visible for a period of about three minutes,
at an estimated altitude of 35°, bearing about 340° true from
a point in Brooklyn, in approximate Latitude 40°-41'N, Longitude
73°-58'W.

It was in the clouds, remaining stationary and emitting
a blueish flash glow. For a period of about 30 seconds, the
intensity of the glow was very marked.

If this information is of any value to you, I shall
be pleased to continue to be on watch for these objects.
