



SUBJECT: Unconventional Aircraft

TO:

Director of Special Investigations Headquarters, USAF Washington 25, D. C.

1. Information was received by 1st District, Col, from headquarters, New angland SUBAR.A. Army Base, Boston 10, Massachusetts, on 5 January 1951, that an unconventional aircraft had been sighted on or about 13 December 1950 over Lake Champlain, Vermont.

- 2. Information obtained is set forth as follows!
 - a. Description: Cigar-shaped object, possibly a rocket,
 4 to 5 yards in length. Object emitted a large fiery
 trail. No sound was heard. During sighting object
 executed a very sharp "L" pattern over Lake Champlain.
 - b. Time: Object was sighted at 2100 hours about 13 December 1950. Length of time of sighting not indicated.
 - c. Sighting of object was by visual means.
 - d. Observers apparently were in city of Winooski, Vermont, at time of sighting and noticed the unconventional object come into view in a southward course from Canada thence turn west over Lako Champlain opposite Burlington to a westerly direction toward White Face Mountain. Altitude estimated at 5,000 feet. Distance of object from observers not indicated.
 - e. Witnesses listed are as follows:



Reliability of witnesses is unknown. Information regarding the unconventional object was related by these witnesses to L/sgt Jwi.111 W. FLYN., Vermont lational Guard, Fort Lthan Allen, Minooski, Vermont.

- f. Weather Light baze, stars and moon could be seen clearly.
- g. No unusual meteorological activity reported.
- h. No photographs available.

3. This report submitted in compliance with AFGSI Letter 785 dated 23 October 1950. Above information transmitted in letter form. Lore expeditious means deemed unnecessary in view of time elapse since sighting was first reported.



sighted by the three men at 1225 hours, mountain time and Sheriff was notified at 1226 hours. The three men reported that the weather at the time of sighting was--light overcast, light snow.

3. ACTION:

- a. Contact with the Forecaster on Duty, Weather Station, Hill Air Force Base, Utah, on 15 December 1950, revealed that the 1230 observation from Gooding, Idaho (13 miles east of Bliss, Idaho) on 14 December 1950 read as follows: Special, Indefinite Ceiling, 1000 ft overcast, visibility 1 mile, Fog. In view of this weather report, statements of witnesses contain obvious weaknesses.
- b. Teletype 16 OSI-12-6 dispatched 1100 hours, 15 December 1950, to Director of Special Investigations, with information copy direct to Commanding General, Air Materiel Command, Wright-Patterson AFB, Dayton, Ohio, Attn: MCIS, containing briefed Spot Intelligence Report of information contained herein.
- c. In accordance with the provisions of AFCSI Letter No. 85, dated 23 October 1950, no further action will be taken by District Office No. 16 reference this reported sighting. The above information is forwarded, in confirmation of Spot Intelligence TWX number 16 OSI-12-6, for your review and action deemed necessary and/or appropriate.
