Following received from CGAD Kodiak: "Recd by phone from Cpl Houghham ACS Marine Operator Anchorage, Alaska Native Service Station at Tatitlek 60-52 N 146-41W reports sighting flares bearing north northwest between 150630Z and 150645Z. Flares also sighted previous 3 nights at about same time. Tatitlek has daily schedule at 0300Z with ACS Anchorage, transmits 3385KC, 2770KC, receives 2980KC, 277-KC, 3385KC. ACS Anchorage has also notified CAA and 10th Rescue."
