All three of these photographs were taken of the same scene and when developed, the one showed objects in the sky that were not apparent on the other two.

Mr. Similar is aware of the fact that the developing process might have brought about an imperfection, but because the spots are regular in appearance and for whatever value might be attached to them, he thought they should be delivered to an Air Force representative. Recent issues of Life Magazine showing pictures of so-called "flying saucers" prompted his thought.


- At the time these pictures were taken, Mr. A was accompanied by his wife and another couple visiting them from Wichita, Kansas. None of those present remember seeing anything in the sky, but they were looking at the scenery rather than in the sky.
- The pictures were taken of the Hollywood "lights" at night time, in a direction as near as can be determined, West South West of the Griffith Park planetarium.
- The pictures were taken about 15 to 20 seconds apart. Three were taken because Mr. wanted to be certain that there was an adequate recording of these lights.
  - Exposure time was 1/25th at a lens opening of 5.6.
  - Pictures were taken on a Kodak model 35.
