features. He didn't observe anything that might be described as an exhaust.

He reported the object to have been traveling Southeast and indicated that the object was in his view for approximately an hour and thirty-five minutes. No estimate of speed or altitude could be given.

In describing the maneuvers of the object, Mr. Semarked that it intermittently seemed to hover and then made sharp variations in altitude. This object was confined to a local area all during the observation.

Mr. did add that he saw what he believed to be definitely a shooting star at approximately 0200 hours; however, he insisted that the object seen earlier didn't have the same characteristics.

Other witnesses to this second observation included Lr. Bensecter's father-Lr.

It should be noted that there had been MO local publicity preceding this observation and, therefore, there is no reason to believe that local hysteria "prompted" the sightings.

Visibility on the night of 15 July at the time of the sighting was reported by local weather station to be approximately twelve miles. The weather therefore was ideal for such an observation.




