

- 1. Unidentified flying object was observed from Lake Forest, Florida 23 July. Sighted between COOLEST and COLEST, and observed for a period of three to four minutes, by a civilian and his wife.
- 2. Reported as a globe of yellow, incandescent light, which was travelling much faster than an F-6h, with noise trailing far behind the object. The shape was undetermined, but it appeared the same on all headings. No navigation or recognition lights were visible.
- 3. The object travelled from the North horizon to the South horizon, Yest of the observer, at an altitude between 2,000 and 3,000 feet. Observer was on the ground at Lake Forest, which is Northwest of Jacksonville, Florida.
 - 4. Weather in the area at time of sighting:
- a. Jacksonville, Florida (0030EST), sky clear, visibility 15 miles, berometer 1019.3, temperature 810, dem point 750, surface wind West 7 MPH, altimeter 30.09.

- 1. Occupation of observer was not reported.
