

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At 9:00 a. m., July 29, 1952, the FBI representative at Madison, Wisconsin, was contacted by representatives of OSI, Truax Field, Madison, Wisconsin. They advised that a rocket-type device had been found in an open area immediately outside the twon of Palmyra, Wisconsin. They stated that the device had "USSR" stamped on three of six fins. The device was found at 2:00 p. m. on Monday, July 28, 1952, by the and the standard of age and Rindt is a recently discharged Korean veteran.

Agents from the Madison Resident Agency proceeded to Palmyra. It was ascertained that the device is two and one-half to three feet in length. Its fins are a dark yellow color. It was found sunk into the ground only five inches and at a 45 degree angle. It appeared as if the rocket had been traveling from north to south. There were no noticeable "bounce" marks in the immediate vicinity. It was ascertained that the above-mentioned two boys had tried to dismantle the device. In so doing they had broken off a spike-like tip which is approximately ten inches in length and which was attached to the detonating chamber of the device. A small wire resembling a cast iron pipe nine inches long and one and one-fourth inches in diameter protruded from the device. This wire was anchored to the inside portion of the device where it appeared there had been a propelling unit of some sort.

Mrs. How of Palmyra advised Agents that on Sunday, July 27, she was awakened at 11:30 p. m. by an electrical storm. She looked out of her window and saw a hed ball of fire. Twenty minutes later she heard an airplane pass over her house (it is to be noted that the device was found approximately one hundred yards south of her house and from the manner that it was sunk into the ground it appeared as if it had passed directly over her house).

ed officers, have examined the device. They advised that it had definitely been fired; that it was not further armed which would preclude the possibility of subsequent detonation. They expressed the opinion that it was fired from a stationary object on a ramp. They claimed that it is not listed in any U. S. technical manuals dealing with rockets.

Preparations are being made by the Milwaukee Office to forward the device to the Technical Laboratory for appropriate examination.
