1. In compliance with letter, Headquarters, USAF, AFOIN-C/CC-2, subject as above, 19 December 1951, the following information, as reported to this headquarters by Mr. [REDACTED], is forwarded. This report was not transmitted by electrical means due to the fact that no other activity or observations were reported from this area and report was not deemed of sufficient value to warrant electrical transmission.

a. Description: Two orange lights, moving at jet speed, no sound, one behind the other, moving North for approximately two miles, then separated, one going Northwest and the other continuing North. The one headed Northwest appeared to get momentarily brighter, then returned to its original glow. Altitude estimated at 1500 feet.

b. Time Sighted: 22150, 27 August 1952.

c. Manner of Observation: Surface-visual.

d. Location of Observer: W Long 96°45', N Lat 32°51', 6521 Trammel Drive, Dallas, Texas. Object first sighted approximately one-half mile West of house and 40° above horizon.

e. Identifying Information on Observer: Mr. [REDACTED] and wife, 6521 Trammel Drive, Dallas, Texas. Mr. [REDACTED] works as bookkeeper at Cook's Modern Home Office. Wife does not work. Average intelligence.

f. Weather: 015 125/87/66 14/993.

g. Other Activity or Condition: None reported.

h. Existence of any Physical Evidence: None reported.

i. Interception or Identification Action Taken: None

j. Location of Air Traffic: Very much aircraft activity in area going in and out of Love Field. Both Mr. [REDACTED] and wife insisted that object sighted was no normal aircraft.
