

SOURCE: Further information on source not available. SUMMARY: A single flying object, 200 feet wide with a delta shape and appearing luminous. traveled without sound on a north to south course at approximately 100 to 125 mph over Needles California at an altitude of 2,000 feet above the terrain. Observation of the flying object was made visually from the surface for a 15 second period on 7 September 1952 at 1930 PST by SOURCE and his wife. Observation was made during hours of darkness with ceiling and visibility unlimited. No physical evidence of the flying object exists. 
INTRODUCTION

1. A letter, dated 8 Oct 52, inclosure 1, containing information on a flying object arrived at this Headquarters on 10 Oct 52 via ordinary mail. Subject letter was addressed to: Intelligence Officer, Norton Air Force Base, San Bernardino, California and carried the following return address: 520 D Street, Needles, California. The source of the letter as derived from the return address and signature was D. H. Tittle, hereafter referred to as SOURCE. SOURCE reliability is unknown and truth of report cannot be judged.

COMERAL.

- 2. SOURCE was sitting on the front porch of his home, the leadles, California, about 1930 PST, 7 September 1952, when he noticed a single object moving aloft from north to south, and he immediately called the attention of his wife to some.
- 3. SOURCE and wife agree that the flying object was of a design as indicated by the facsimile sketch attached as inclosure 2, i.e., a delta wing type aircraft. SOURCE writes that the airial performance of the object was similiar to that of a delta wing aircraft and that the flying object made no noise and maintained a steady course. SOURCE writes that approximately 15 seconds elapsed from the time he initially observed the flying object until it passed beyond some trees which interrupted his line of sight.
- A. SOURCE initially writes that he could not determine the flying objects size, speed, or distance, but feels that it was at least one (1) mile away. SOURCE then writes that in the event the flying object was one (1) mile to the Hast of his position, he would estimate it to be flying at an altitude of 2,000 feet at 100-125 mph, and its width approximately 200 feet. SOURCE states that it would be difficult to estimate the thickness of the flying object as he and his wife could not see it clearly at anytime.
- 5. SOURCE writes that the flying object was light in color and seemed to have a dull glow or slight luminescence. SOURCE feels that the objects color or luminous appearance was not a result of reflected light from the city as it maintained its color or luminous appearance after passing over the city onto the desert. SOURCE writes that there were no clouds in the vicinity and that the moon did not rise for another hour. SOURCE further writes that he has ruled out the possibility that the unidentified object could have been a large flock of ducks or other birds because of the above.
- 6. SOURCE writes that he has rulled out the possibility that the unidentified object could have been a conventional aircraft as he is familiar with same, and believes that the only explanation for the unidentified object would be some atompheric condition which formed a cloud-like shape that traveled in a direction opposite to the light prevailing breeze. SOURCE writes that such existancy, however, would not explain the dull glow that made the object visible on a dark night.

7. SOURCE writes that he feels his information on his sighting will be vague, but that he has explained the matter to the best of his ability under the circumstances. SOURCE writes that he has reported this sighting to substantiate other possible reports of the same, that he felt it his duty as a citizen to render such report, and that he will answer queries on the sighting to the best of his ability.

- 9. No physical evidence of the sighting such as fragments, photographs, or the like were included in report from SOURCE and existance of same was not reported.
- 10. No interception or identification action was taken by the 27th Air Division (Defense), responsibile for same in the area of this sighting.
- 11. A report of air traffic in the vicinity of Needles, California at the time of this sighting has not been obtained.
- 12. Interview of SOURCE to obtain possible additional information or to evaluate reliability of SOURCE has not been attempted due to geographical location, i.e., distance, of SOURCE from this installation.





Subject: Unidentified Object

Last night while sitting on my front porch at Needles, about 8:30 PM, I noticed an object moving from north to south and immediately called the attention of my wife to it. I have no way of knowing its size, speed, nor how far away it was, but I feel rather sure it was at least a mile away and probably farther.

My wife and I agree that it was this shape:

Direction of Travel

In other words it was on the order of a delta type craft and moved thru the air like the above type does. It made no noise and kept on a steady course. I estimate that from the time I first saw it, until it was shielded from view by some tall trees, about 15 seconds elapsed.

FRONT

In the event this object was a mile to the east of where I was, I might roughly estimate that it was at an altitude of 2,000 ft. and was going about 100 - 125 miles per hour and its width about 200 ft. I would be hard to estimate its thickness, because we could not, at any time, see it very clearly.

This matter was light in color and seemed to glow a very dull glow, or was by some phoenomenon slightly luminous itself.

I feel rather certain that the object was not lit up by the lights of the city, because it was just the same dull intensity after it had passed over the city and continued on over the desert. There were no clouds in the immediate vicinity, and it was fully an hour or more before the moon came up.

I have ruled out the possibility that it might have been a large flock of ducks or other birds because of the above.

I also have ruled out the possibility of its being a conventional aircraft, as I know them anyway, at least.

The only thing I can think it might have been would be an atmospherie condition forming a cloud-like shape and sending it in a direction almost opposite the light prevailing breeze that was moving at that time.




Of course this does not explain the dull glow that made it be seen on the dark night, so I guess I will just keep on guessing and wondering.






