





1. Description of Object: One (1) or two (2) relatively short condensation, or exhaust trails, extending generally upward from an unidentified object. The object itself was not reported as having been sighted. Felatively slow speed reported - too slow for jet-type aircraft - and no sound was heard. Shape varied, with some people reporting it as being eliptical, later shortening to nearly circular; others reported it to a pear similar to a comet tail, while still others reported trails (two) to be "hot dog" shaped, short, compact, and not at all similar to the usual jet or vapor trail. Trail was reported to be approximately 15 times as long as it was wide. Color was variously reported as:


- a. ". ale, but shining, yellow at first, but becoming reddish later."
- b. "The appearance of a brilliantly lighted half moon."
- o. "Fercuruous, or molten, like the sun when you look at it at moontime."
- d. "Hot so mercuruous; sort of light brown."

Object (or trail), was in sight for approximately 20 minutes, first reported as slowly descending, and then changing to a horizontal course. One person reported the two (2) trails to be fairly equal in shape and size, and apparently eminating from a common source. A second observer reported two (2) trails observed during descent, and one (1) trail while in a horizontal position, with the horizontal trail being approximately 20 times as long as the descending trails. Still a third person reported only one trail, which appeared to the observer to be a normal con trail modified in appearance by the fact that the sun was at a lower position on the horizon than the trail, with sun rays thus reflecting from below the object, or trail. No particular maneuver could be described by observers, other than a slow, generally descending course. Speeds of both descending and horizontal flight appeared to be about the same. Actual size, in feet, could not be estimated because of unknown distances involved. One observer estimated trail to be at least 15 miles distant.

- 2. Time: The most detailed account of this phearwation covered the period of 1905 to 1925, racific daylight savings time(8 Soptember 1952) Other times were reported as 1900 (for 4 minutes), 1920, and 2130, all on 8 September.
- 3. Manner of Observation: All observations were by visual means, with no optic or electronic equipment being utilized. It had been erroneously reported that meteorologists of the Fresno Meather Sureau had tracked object with their instruments, however, inquiry revealed this not to be the case. One meteorologist from the weather station did observe trail, but only visually, and from his residence during off-duty hours.
- 4. Location: Reports were received from scattered points in the general vicinity of Fresno, primarily Dinuba, Henford, Fresno proper, and Kingsburg.
- a. Dinuba: Observation took place from street on eastern edge of town (approximately 36 32N 111 24W). Trails (two) were observed to west by southwest, at approximately 45 degree line of sight angle, and at an estimated distance of 15 miles.
- b. Fresno: Observation took place from yard of rivate residence located on northern outskirts of Fresno (approximately 36 47% 119 47%). One trail was observed from west to northwest, at approximate 25 degree to 30 degree line of sight angle. Object, or trail, was estimated to be at approximately 30,000 to 35,000 feet.

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5. Maliability of Information:

a. ir. California: This can had not reviously reported unidentified aerial objects, however, his interest in this particular subject is so intense, that the investigating officer would classify him as a fanatio. Stated that he had even written to the resident of the United States regarding the national policy and outlook on "flying amoors". He very definitely feels the robability of "visitors from an outer world". A cripple, confined to a wheelshair, and unemployed, he devotes a large portion of his time to study of this topic.


b. Wr. Fresno Weather Bureau, Fresno: A former USAF Weather Officer new employed as a meteorologist. Appeared quite stable and intelligent, and discounted his own observation as nothing more than a normal con trail. We felt that the late hour, position of the sum, distance, etc., all combined to make observation appear unexplainable.

- 6. Weather: Clear sky-winds light and variable, of less than 5 Mill velocity (as reported by Castle AF Base Weather Office).
 - 7. Related Activities or Conditions: None determined.
 - S. Physical Evidence: None.
 - 9. Interesption or Identification Action: None determined.
- 10. Local Air Traffic: Aeronautical facilities in the Freeno area were checked to determine possibility of any aircraft known to be airborne in the area at this particular time, but negative results were obtained. No local records were available to indicate what other siroraft may have been flying the Freeno area at this time.

Sir, was there an identified or known aerial object over the area south of Freeno and west of Dinuba botween 7:05 and 7:25 P.M., Monday, Sept. 3th?

At about 7:05 rd Sept 8th I saw westward (a little south of west), an object which seemed to be slowly descending from "upstairs" perpendicularly to the ground. Actually I could not see or hear the object, but could see the relatively "short" exhaust or valor tail or trail. There were, in this descent, at least 2 of these short streamings extending upward from the descending object.

Incidentally the object appeared to be about at least 50 degrees above the horizon. After descending for a time, the object turned northward (from here, it looked as though it headed toward Freene). After it started northward still 40 - 50 degrees above the horizon, the exhaust or vapor (?) tail, still clinging to the object, lengthened greatly in comparison to the tail during descent. The object continued to seem to travel relatively slow, for it remained in sight here for at least 20 minutes.


The tail or trail seemed to remain a constant length as the object went north.


I live in the east part of Dinuba. The object was not seen by me, due to trees, etc obstructions, after 7:15 PM, but my brother-in-law who lives on the northern outskirts of Dinuba had a clearer view and he saw it until about 7:25 PM when the exhaust or vapor tail or trail seem to disappear and the object seemed to become a ball before it disappeared from his view completely.

My nophew, about 9 yrs old, also observed that the object seemed to go "too slow for a jet" and the trail wasn't like they usually are.

Too no sound was heard(here).

I thought that newscasts (from Freeno's KMJ or KFRM) this morning might report and identify the object. But there were no reports to my knowledge.

JET 'TRAILER' IS BLAMED FOR 'BALL OF FIRE'

Great balls of fire!

That is what many San Joaquin Valley residents swear they saw in the northwest sky last evening.


In Hanford many people reported it to Police Lieutenant Jack Holcomb; a California Highway Patrolman was halted on the Golden State Highway near Kingsburg by motorists who pointed it out, and many people in Fresno and other nearby areas watched it.


To some it appeared eliptical, later shortening to nearly circular, but other reports said it looked like the tail of a comet.

Meteorologists of the Fresno Weather Bureau to whom it appeared to be almost west, said it apparently was a vapor trail laid down by a jet plane at about 35,000 feet altitude and illuminated by the rays of the setting sun.

The vapor had a pale, but shining, yellow color at first but became reddish later, and according to some reports drifted northwestward about 9:30 PM.

The vapor trail had the appearance of a brilliantly lighted half moon for Doris Webb of 230 Clarke Street. Webb said he was standing near Tulare and Divisadero Streets when he viewed the sight. He said it appeared to be moving northward and eventually disappeared.






