1. The following information was furnished this headquarters by the Commanding Officer, 1953d AACs Squadron, Misawa AFB, Japan, in message, date-time-group 102345Z February 1953.

2. Unidentified Radar Targets spotted on GCA azimuth scope at 100945Z. Plotted in vicinity of Misawa Homer approximately 1 1/2 miles from station. Objects seen on both 2 and 10 mile azimuth scopes. Traffic check revealed no known aircraft in vicinity. F-94 scrambled at 101013Z. Object not plotted or seen visually by aircraft. Aircraft reported radar interference. VHF interference noted by GCA, tower and operators of ground radio. Objects seen on GCA scopes and plotted. Reported flying at approximately 50 knots. Weather was VFR. Targets were solid and definite, birds or other fowl discounted.
