Dear Lt.;

This is quite a batch coming back at you. I think the idea of being in readiness with a press release is a good idea. I should like to have Dr. comments on our Pinchbottle cases.

In two cases here we are taking the liberty of sending out Form As, with an accompanying note stating that the sighting has been referred to us as having possible astronomical significance, and would they oblige us by filling out the report. If you have any objection to this procedure please let us know.

As to seeing you in the near future, I hope so too. Did you know I am sailing for Europe on August 26th. I'll send you a postcard from Paris! The project here will lie fallow, I'm afraid, during September, but we will attack these problems with great strength in October. Now to get on to business.

There appears to be only two possible pachbottles in this last batch: The 21 June Okinawa and the 22 June Goose AFB. On both of these I should like to request a complete report and follow-up.

The Okinawa one may yet prove to be a balloon, though the evidence is against it. Object going against wind and object disappearing into cloud with relative velocity of 45 kts. I think the best thing to do is to wait for further data. I am asking Jen to needle both you and me on these follow-ups becase there is no point in having follow-ups unless they are followed up!

The Goose AFB also needs follow-up with special attention to the 9 questions on our Form "Eye".


Now as to the others: we pass by with a smirk the little monkey man.

I saw an object which I would estimate between 55,000 and 50,000 feet high directly over the Control Tower. I observed this object through binoculars and it appeared to be round and shiney. It was between the size of a pin and a pea. There was just one object. There appeared to be some darker shade in the background. There was no trail or exhaust. All the time we were watching it, it appeared to stay in one place. There was no speed or sound. It disappeared while I was rewinding the camera.

The time was 1845 and I observed it about ten (10) minutes.

I viewed the object through the binoculars and also naked eye from the Control Tower. We went out on the walk around the tower.


I observed this object from Tinker Air Force Base Control Tower. It was directly over my head and appeared to be between 35,000 to 50,000 feet.

I have been working in the control tower for two (2) years.

The sky was clear behind the object. There were scattered clouds to Northwest, North, Northeast. The temperature was 90°; the sun was to the West 1 hour 3 minutes to sundown. The wind was South - Southeast about 15 knots.

I received a call from Base Operations and they told us that a guard had spotted the object at 50,000 feet. I thought at the time they called that it would be useless to go look for it at such an altitude. I went out and looked around and spotted it directly ever the field and looked at it for a minute or two through the binoculars. Then I returned to the tower and got the camera. I took seven (7) pictures lying on my back placing it on the railing. After taking the seventh picture while winding the camera, it disappeared completely. We notified operations and they said they were making out a report to send to Bashington and they wanted to know if we had taken any pictures. That is all the information we gave them. We contacted the tower chief and he came up to the tower and turned in the report that I filled out to Crypto Conter.

There was no air traffic in the area at that time.



The object I saw was round in shape and white in color. It was very small, smaller than a pea. I just saw one object. There was no trail nor echaust. It didn't appear to be moving. I just glanced at it. I was not looking at it when it disappeared.

I don't remember what time it was when I saw this object. I observed it for just a few seconds.


I was at Tinker Air Force Base Control Tower when I observed this object. The object was directly above the tower. I would say the object was around 50,000 feet high.

I have worked in the tower for about one (1) month.

In the West there were a few scattered clouds. Just a little after the object disappeared, the sun went behind the clouds. In the last it was clear.

I didn't take any photographs nor obtain any fragments.

I didn't see any airtraffio at this time.



The object was round, very shiney like chrome. I would estimate it to be from 50,000 to 35,000 feet high. I am unable to estimate the size. I saw only one (1) object. There was no trail or eminust. He speed whatsoever; in fact, it didn't nove. There was no sound. It was stationary in the sky. I didn't see the object when it disappeared. Looking at it through glasses, every once in a while it looked like from above samething would dart out from either side. It looked like it hung from some other object. I was at Timber Air Force Base Control Hower when I saw this object. The object was located directly overhead. I would estimate the object to be 30,000 to 35,000 feet high.





No fragments or physical evidence of the object were observed.

Civilian Guard Tinker Air Force Base 3 July 1953 I could see one (1) object, real bright and sort of star shaped. It did not look too big; it looked like a big star. I would say the ovening star - real bright. There was no trail nor exhaust. It looked like it was stationary. When it left it just vanished. There was no cound. It must have been about 1905 when I saw it. I watched it for three (3) or four (4) minutes.

I observed the object with my naked eye from the ground.

It looked like it was West of Tinker Air Force Base and South of 29th Street. It was 45,000 or 50,000 feet high.

I have been on the Guard Force for eleven (11) years. I am usually exposed to the weather and observe aircraft over the field.

The weather was clear, the sun shining. There were a few floating clouds.

I boliove it was a weather balloon. The sun was shining on it.

Timber Air Force Dase 3 July 1953 I saw one object. It was round and looked like metal. It was aluminum in color. No trail nor exhaust. When I had the field glasses on it, it waved back and forth and when it left it just vanished. There was no sound. It vanished immediately.

It was about 1855 when I saw it. I watched it about ten (10) minutes. I was watching it when it disappeared.

I observed the object visually from the ground and I used binoculars. The binoculars I used were 7X50. With the natural eye it looked like a big tea cup. When I got the glasses on it, it looked like about 12" in diameter.

The object was directly overhead (Timber Air Force Base).

I have been on the guard force at Tinker Air Force Base for eleven and one half years. (112). I view aircraft at all times while on duty.

The weather was clear; there were no clouds - nothing to block the vision.

There was no fragments or physical evidence of the object.

I think it was a big weather outfit; a big balloon. I would judge the object to be about 40,000 feet high.

Tinker Air Force Base
3 July 1953

I saw bus (1) object. It was white or silver in color. I would say that it was approximately 24" X 26" in diameter and it was round. There was no trail nor emaust. It stood still for approximately five (5) minutes and it seemed to disappear behind a cloud. The clouds were real high.

I saw this object around 1915 and I watched it for about five (5) minutes.

I am uncertain as to the exact time I went out to look at it.

The object was visual from the ground. I used bimoculars but never could first it.

The object was almost directly straight up and a little South from where I was standing. (Tinker Air Force Base).

I have been on the guard force at Tinker Air Force Base for seven and one half years (7%). I was in the Havy one and one-half (1%) years abound an aircraft carrier observing aircraft.

There was very little surface winds. There was a small hasiness this object went bohind.

It seemed to me that this object was around 40,000 feet to 45,000 feet high. Ropes or string appeared to be hanging from the object. I think the last reflections of the sum rays was what made all of us see it so easily. I believe it was a weather balloon.

No fragments or physical evidence of the object were observed.

Civilian Guard Force Tinker Air Force Base 3 July 1953 From a distance the object appeared to be like an airplane. I couldn't tell for sure whether it was round or oblong. It was silver in color. I would say it was about the size of a B-29. It was a solid object; it was not exactly round. There was no trail or emaust. There was no sound. It stood still for 15 minutes after I started watching it. When it moved, I would say the speed was from between 200 and 400 miles per hour. It stood still over Tinker Air Force hase for about 15 minutes and them it moved almost directly ever the field. It was just a little South of me. It stayed there about 15 minutes. It started Northwest and disappeared immediately. It didn't change color. It looked like a bright light. The light was on all the time that I could tell.

I saw the object at 1830 hours and observed it for 30 minutes.

I observed the object from the ground. I was standing still. I did not use field glasses or binoculars. There was only one object.

When I saw the object I was at Gate No. 27, Tinker Air Force Base. The object was slightly East and South, them it noved to Northwest and stopped practically due over the field. I would say it was about 40,000 feet high.

I have been employed on the Guard Force at Tinkor Air Force Base for eleven (11) years.

The weather was very clear and fair. The wind was approximately 15 to 20 mph South Easterly. Around 1900 scattered clouds came up in Southwest.

I did not take any photographs and did not obtain any fragments.

There was one aircraft came in pretty high from the West about 13 minutes after it left.

The object appeared to have a light on and it remained on at all times I observed it. The color of the light didn't change at any time.

Civilian Guard Timker Air Force Base 6 July 1953 The object looked round and was real shiney. It was perfectly still; then it moved a couple of feet West across the field and stopped. Once in a while it moved just a little to the West. There was no trail or exhaust. I wasn't watching when it disappeared.

It was about 1815 whom I saw the object and I watched it for about 20 minutes.

This object was visual from the ground.

I was at Cate No. 27, Tinker Air Force Base, when I saw this object. The object was about 10° East of me. I don't have any idea how high the object was. It was very, very high; I couldn't estimate the altitude.

I have been on the Guard Force at Tinker Air Force Base for 21 years.

The weather was very clear and there was a slight breeze.

I didn't take any photographs nor obtained any fragments.

There was no aircraft in the air.

The object looked round just like a big baseball; it was bright white it looked like the moon with the sun shining on it in the daylight. There
was just one object. There was no trail or exhaust. At times it looked like
it moved. It moved Westward slowly. There was no sound. When it disappeared
it just vanished. I couldn't locate it any more. The object was just West of
straight up when it went out.

I can this object at 1800 and I vatched it for one (1) hour.

The object was visible from the ground. I first sew this just slightly East and slightly South of me. About 15° East.

I was at Cate No. 27. Tinker Air Force Base, when I saw this object. I would say it was at least 35,000 to 40,000 feet high.

I have been on the Guard Force at Timber Mir Force Base for eleven (11) years. During this time I have observed aircraft.

There were a few clouds in the West. It was clear in the East. No clouds were directly overhead. The wind was out of South - Southeast.

I did not take any pictures and no fragments were obtained.

Along toward 1835 there was a B-29 going Bast flying high over the field. I would say it was flying at 10,000 feet.

The object I caw started getting dim and faded away until you couldn't see it.

On 2 July 1955, I saw one object. It was round as a balloon or a dish. As high as it was, it would be hard to say whether it would be metal because anything could reflect the sunlight. It seemed to stand still, but when I looked through the glasses it seemed to be moving back and forth within a short radius. I couldn't see anything hanging on it at all. When it left it seemed to go straight up; it did not go sideways. If it had been a balloon it would have burst. There was no sound.

I saw this object between 1850 and 1900; I think about 1845. I watched it for approximately 10 or 15 minutes and it went out of sight. I stayed 10 or 15 minutes longer to see whether or not it would come back. It went out of sight about 1900.

I observed this object through Binoculars No. 7x50 from the ground.

The object was about 5° S.W. from directly overhead (Timber Air Force Base).

I have had quite a bit of experience observing aircraft in the air.

I was in the Air Corp for four (4) years and have worked three (3) years on the Guard Force at Tinker Air Force hase. I see quite a bit of aircraft in the air while on duty.

The weather was clear. There was a blue sky background.

The object was 40,000 to 50,000 feet high.

Civilian Cuard Tinker Air Force Base 3 July 1955 I saw one object. It looked like a large bright star; it was a bright white. It appeared to be round in shape. It looked approximately 4" or 5" in diameter. There was no trail or exhaust. There was no speed or sound. I didn't see the object move at all. The object was directly overhead.

I observed this object for approximately 4 or 5 seconds at a time.

I observed this object visually from the ground.

I was at Gate No. 27, Tinker Air Force Base, when I saw this object. I couldn't estimate how high the object was.

I have been on the Guard Force, Tinker Air Force Base, for about 10% years. I have seen a lot of weather ballooms and never have seen anything like this.

I don't remember about the weather.

I didn't take any photographs and didn't obtain any fragments of it.

I didn't soo any aircraft in the air at that time.


