




SUBJECT: Unidentified Phenomena Observed in Sky, N.E. of Fort Worth, Texas, on 9 July 1953

- 1. Information was received on this subject from Mr.

 , an employee of Convair, Department who resides at the first worth, Texas.
 - 2. advised that at approximately 2115 hours, 9 July 1953, he had just finished a church activity at the Ridgecrest Baptist Church and was locking the front door of the church in preparation to leaving when he observed a blue, hazy, glowing light northeast from the front of the church which faces in a westerly direction. The blue, hazy light had no definite outline and appeared to be travelling in a southwesterly direction. It changed course and travelled in a westerly direction for what appeared to be a short distance and again changed course to a southwesterly direction. The total time this blue, hazy light was visible was approximately three (3) or four (4) seconds and was unable to identify a shape or form which might be cattributed to the light. further advised that he was unable to estimate the altitude of the light; however, believed it to be at the same altitude as normal aircraft in could not state whether or not the blue, hazy light could flight. be attributed to the flying saucer paenomena. (3) other persons were present at the time he saw the light and whom he also believed saw it. I identified these persons as: Mrs. his wife; Mr. Tesiding at Halwho resides in the tom City; and, a Mr. . Haltom City.
 - 3. For your information is believed to be somewhat sensitive about this matter, believing that he might be held up to ridicule at his place of work should his name be used in this connection. He is willing to give any information desired irrespective of any other consideration.
 - 4. The foregoing is submitted for your information in the event that you desire to submit information pursuant to Air Force Letter 200-5,








Please be advised that approximately 2115 hours, 9 July 1953, just having finished a church activity at the Ridgecrest Bastist Church, I observed one object of a blue or purple color traveling at a very high rate of speed. There was no sound apparant to me. The object maneuvered sharply with the exception of a momentary hovering motion, and disappeared in a northwesterly direction at a very high rate of speed. re ceruls ed of actievreede le boirres ens esanties blucus I four seconds. It is further estimated that the object went over the Lake Worth Area, and continued to travel and disappear in a northwestern direction. It was impossible for me to give an accurate estimation of the altitude. The object was at an approximate 60° angle from the point where I was standing, but appeared to be at the same altitude of a normal airplane in Illaht. This object was also observed at the time and in my processor by my wife, its Mr. Halton Gity, and Br. who resides in the ! Halton City.
