

SUMMARY OF INFORMATION

17 April 1954, pursuant to information received by this office, this Chicago Coast mard 1st in, Navy Per, Chicago, Illinots, concerning an alleged parachute-like object winning over the waterfront seen and reported by a Mrs. Lelah H. Stoker, 3121 Forth 1 37 day of April 1954. At 1645 hours Neal stated Mrs. Stoker reports to the form hovering urea was a Belmont Yacht Club (3200 north) at an est eted at an approximated distance of 2000 to 3000 rest off share within five minutes, Neal, accompanied by other coast guardsmen, proceeded by seasonait to the area arriving there about 20 minutes later.
