- 1. I am the foreman in charge of Box and Lumber Reclamination in the Material Pacilities Division at Middletown Air Material Area, Middletown, Pennsylvania. I have worked at Clasted Air Force Base as a civilian employee for approximately ten years.
- 2. On Thursday evening my wife that and a friend of mine, The was approximately thirteen minutes to ten o'clock.
 - 5. I looked into the sky in an easterly direction and saw a semi-oval object with an orange glow moving in a northerly direction. This object appeared to me to have come out of the southeast part of Pennsylvania.
 - 4. I would judge that this object was approximately a mile and a half to two miles above the ground level. It seemed to me that it was at the same height as the broken clouds in the sty at that time. It leeked like the size of a grapofruit.
 - 5. This object definitely appeared to me to be moving faster than the speed of my commercial plans I had seem. It continued to move at the same speed at all times. It did not nove in an are formation and I would say it remained in the same plane at all times.
 - fifteen seconds. It finally disappeared from view when it went behind a tree in my back yard. It did not make any sound that I could hear. My wife and Mr. Lindowsth were watching with me at all times.
 - 7. My wife and Mr. Million becompained no to the back yard where I thought we could get a better glimpee of this object.
 - 8. It seemed to be a mitter of only a few seconds, after we went into the yard, that I heard My manually "there it goes." I was looking in the sky speelf but did not see this object the second time. Mr. Manually stated that the object which he saw on the second occasion appeared to retrace the path it followed on the first sighting. He added that it was much brighter, seemed to move faster and shot upward into the sky out of sight when he saw it for the second time.
 - 8. We all left my yard and went to a nearby parking lot where there were no lights to interfere with our vision. Once again I scanned the sky for a glimpse of the object which I described above. There was no trace of it.
