

feet. Upon questioning. Lated his flight instructors did not comment on the size of the object, but that he would estimate it to have been about the same size as a Twin Beechersft. Upon his return to his girl friend's house, 3912 Weyburn Drive, stated he telephoned Carevell, and while talking to an officer of Carevell AFB, the object moved west and disappeared. Lated that subsequently another object appeared and remained stationary for a short period and it, too, disappeared. During the telephone conversation with Ly Special Agent WILES, stated another object of the same description was at that time, 2225 hours, again visible, howering about one mile north of the TCU Airport.

- J. At 2240 hours, Mrman GALLACHER was again telephonically contested for any saditional occurrences, and he stated that the VAP tower operator, Carsus II AFB, object over Meachem Lirport. Bowever, upon request, GilliaGREE obtained information from Amedant tower through the Carevall life tower that a DC-3 aircraft had landed to the south at Heaches Flald, just after (40proximately three minutes) the reported sightime t HER also advised that all redar trained on the unidentified object as proviously described had, at intervals, lost and regulard the blip on their scopes. Gillicher was at this time requested to advise the CSI of any serious developments.
- As about Offis hours, 29 April 1954, Major RICE advised Special Agent MILES the object which had been visible on the Storm Detector Radar in the Base Weather Station the previous evening had again been visible at about 0700 hours, 29 April 1954. Upon recheck at about Offis hours by Major RICE and Special Agent WILES, the object was visible, positioned as previously described. Special Agent WILES requested: Major RICE, upon metification of 7th Bomb Wing Intelligence Office, in accordance with Ruse Operations SOP, to advise that effice that the information obtained by OSI would be made available upon request.
