Sorembling out of Greater Pittschurgh Lirport at 03003, 24 May 1954, Ger station "Sasbeg" informed that a GOC position spotted an orange light at about 35.000 feet in the Gleveland area. Appreaching Sleveland on a bearing of 7100. altitude 17,000 feet, I observed an orange light alightly west of the city at that seemed to be approximately 15,000 feet, about 20 miles directly abaed of the aircraft. Occasionally the light alternated to a red glov. Although my sireraft was indicating much .92, the rate of evertake seemed extremely slow. the light disappeared three times, reappearing west of detroit at approximately 19,000 feet, an setimated 40 miles away. No further visual contact was made.

Not ther Gol reder at "gasbag" nor "sylvia" painted any object in the area conserved nor did the rader in my sireraft show may indications. The sky condittion was plant and the visibility was extremely good-
