SCIENTISTS WHO HAVE SEEN UFOS

Dr. H. Percy Wilkins, a Fellow of the Royal Astronomical Society, and a top moon authority. (deceased - 1961) Incident: June 11, 1954 - Dr. Wilkins was a passenger on a plane flying between Charleston, W. VA. & Atlanta, GA. They were flying at 8,000! when he saw two brilliant, oval-shaped objects hovering over two lofty cloud masses. He described them as sharp-edged with the color of burnished gold, at a distance estimated at 2 miles. A third UFO was seen in the shade of the cloud, and its color was gray! the two UFOs started moving against the wind, the third following in a wide arc. All three vanished into the thick cloud. Duration: 2 minutes. - Dr. Wilkins.
