Transmitted herewith for your information is one (1) copy of Report of Investigation of Special Agent WILLIAM W. DEMNIS, JR., District Office No. 21, dated 3 August 1954, file 53-(24)-11, subject as above. 2. Subsequent to writing the attached report, the District Commander, DO #21, was advised by the District Intelligence Officer, 5th Naval District, that investigation by his office revealed a witness who approached near enough to the object in question to identify it as a smoke pot. The District Intelligence Officer is of the opinion that the reported movement of the object can be accounted for by reason of smoke being blown away from the object by the wind. The District Intelligence Officer advised that there was extensive naval activity in the area of subject sighting and that a helicopter operating in the vicinity observed considerable dunnage in the area. The District Intelligence Officer believes that the smoke pot was used during some naval exercise in which no attempt was made to recover the pot, and the dunnage may well be parts of unrecovered experimental models. 3. No further investigative action is contemplated and the files of the Office of Special Investigations are considered closed. 4. 

- 1. This investigation was initiated on 30 July 1954 by the District Conmander upon information received from and at the telephonic request of Captain WILLIMI L. MESSMER, District Intelligence Officer (DIO), 5th Naval District, Norfolk, Va. The DIO advised that his Office had received information from their Baltimore Office to the effect that at 1500 hours, 27 July 1954, individuals aboard two fishing vessels located southeast of Ocean City, Md., observed an object variously described as a red ball or a ball of red flame, which entered the water approximately 15 miles southeast of Ocean City. The witnesses stated that they observed the object for approximately 15 minutes and variously estimated the speed to be from 8 to 24 knots. One witness observed the object through binoculars. Some of the witnesses stated that the object traveled submerged part of the time, others that it traveled on the surface. The DIO further advised that the water in the area in question is too shallow to permit the operation of a submarine at Snorkel depth and no Naval craft of that type were in the vicinity at the time of sighting. The DIO requested OSI to determine whether any Langley AFB activity or the National Advisory Cormittee for Aeronautics could account for subject sighting.

- 3. On 30 July 1954 DALE SCHEFEL, 1st Lt, US.F, 10 2094381, Dase Operations, was telephonically contacted and after reviewing his records, advised that Langley AFB had not lost any aircraft on 27 July 1954; that there had been no reported loss of aircraft wing tip tanks on 27 July 1954 and further that Langley AFB aircraft do not conduct firing or bombing practice over the area in question.
- 4. On 30 July 1954, Mr. Acting Engineer-in-Charge, Pilotless Aircraft Research Station, National Advisory Committee for Aeronautics, Temperonceville, Va. (Vallops Island, Va.), was telephonically contacted by and stated in effect that on 27 July 1954 his organization fired a 2-1/2" rocket and a Research Model. The missiles were tracked by radar. The 2-1/2" rocket struck the water approximately 5500 yards from the point of launching. The Research Model struck the water approximately 5000 yards from the point of launching. The points of import of the missiles were approximately 30 miles from Subject sighting. Advised that no attempt is made to recover such missiles. Further advised that during the past three months his organization has not launched any missiles which have a fuel expectancy of more than three (3) seconds and that the missiles cited above landed within an area of two hundred yards from the impact points indicated above.

SYNOPSIS

DOWNGRADED AT 3 YEAR INTERVALE, DECLASSIFIED AFTER 12 YEARS. DOD DIR 5200.10

Investigation requested by District Intelligence Officer, 5th Maval District, to determine if any Langley AFB activity was responsible for an unidentified object observed approximately 15 miles southeast of Ocean City, Md. 27 July 1954. Investigation revealed no Air Force activity at LAFB which could account for the sighting. NACA Station, Wallops Island, Va., advised that they fired a rocket and a Research Model on 27 July 1954, but that the points of impact of these missiles as checked, by radar were approximately 30 miles from Subject sighting.
