# On Michigan Front

#### Flint Woman Heads State Library Board.

Lansing—Election of Mrs. Verna Barkey of Flint as chairman of the state board for libraries was announced Wednesday. She is school librarian.

Arthur Yabroff, business manager of the Detroit public

library, is vice chairman.

The observers said the objects were traveling at tremendous speed at an extreme height. Spokesmen for the air filter defense center in Grand Rapids said there was no radar contact with the objects.

The astronomers were Clarke Burgeon, 25, and William McLaughlin, 32, of Ionia.
