The Manhattan, Brooklyn and Long Island areas have been very active with power search light operation. Search light beams reflecting from the smoke or haze layer or from low cloud decks and with otherwise good night visibility, lend impetus to observation of unknown air activity. A search light orbit is apt to appear as though suddenly reversed (in direction) (Ref para 2) and lack of a reflecting cloud-surface would make the object disappear.

I have no doubt the objects observed were both the result of search light activity and the reflection on under surfaces of low hanging clouds.
