The first two objects seemed to travel north and north-west after appearing in the east. The third object appeared in the north traveling south and the remaining two were observed in the east, traveling east. No visual aids used. The observer was positive that the objects were not aircraft.			11. COMMENTS The sources' descriptions of the objects could possible fit that of a meteorite shower. A neighbor who was also a observer refused to get excited over the sighting because he dismissed the sighting as "shooting stars". In the opinion of this headquarters the sighting can be attributed to a possible meteor activity.
