The reason I wrote so late is that I did not ^{know} who to tell. I saw this address in the book "Secrets of Space Flight".

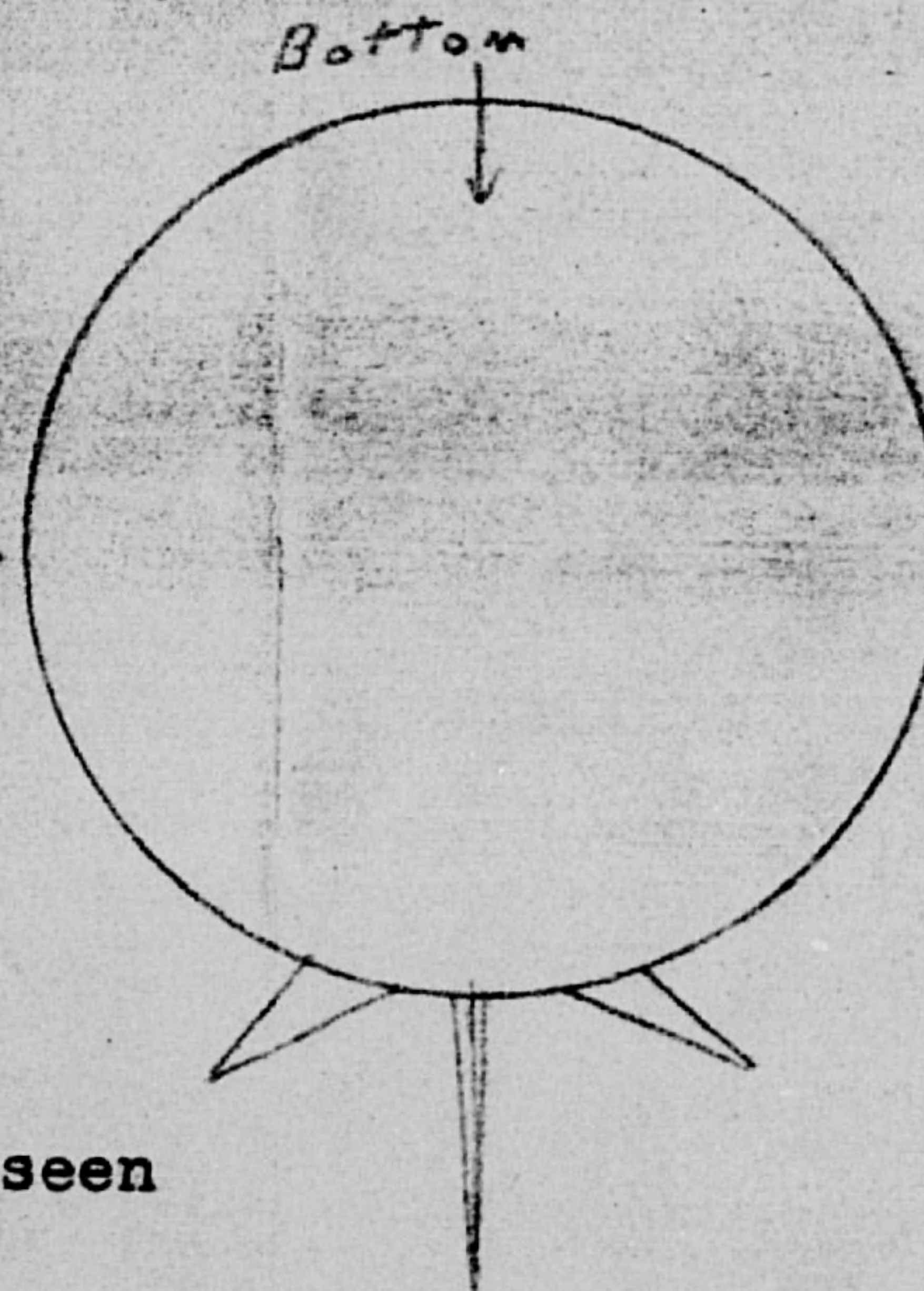
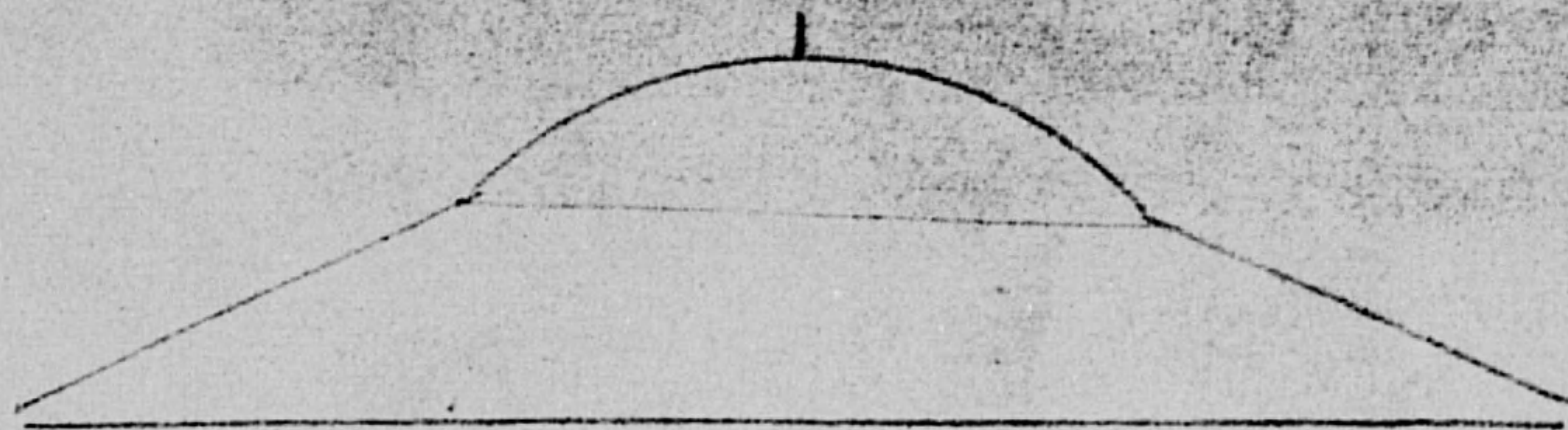
