



THE EARLY MORNING OF SAT. JAN 21, 1956 - AFTER HAVING COMPLETED A ROUND THROUGH CHEMICAL PLANT WHERE I AM EMPLOYED AS A GUARD - THE TIME WAS 3.39 AM PLUS - HAD TAKEN A SEAT IN GATE HOUSE AND WAS LOOKING IN A WESTERLY DIRECTION TOWARD ROUTE 17 N.J.

AT THIS MOMENT - MOVING IN A NORTHERLY DIZECTION THEIRE APPEAILED AN OBJECT IN THE SKY. ITS FRONT WAS BALL SHAPED AND TO THE REAR. - SEVERAL TAIL LIKE SHAPES FLASHED OUT TO THE REAR OF THE BALL LIKE FRONT.

THE FRONT OR BALL SEEMED TO CONTAIN A MAGS OF SEETHING GASES. THEY SEEMED TO BE IN A GREAT STATE OF AGITATION. THE COLORS WITHIN THE BALL SEENIED TO CHANGE FIRST GREEN - THEN BLUE AND FINALLY YELLOW. THE ICEAR - OIR THE TAILS WEIZE MORE LIKE A BLEND OF THE THREE COLORS. THOUGH MORE OR LESS INACTIVE AND MUCH LESS BRILLIANT THAN THE BALL.

SURROUNDING THE MAIN OBJECT COMPLETELY BALL AND TAILS - FOR WHAT MUST HAVE BEEN QUITE A DISTANCE THE GLOW REFLECTED IN THE SKY WAS EXTICEMELY NOTICEAR SEEMED AS THOUGH THE OBJECT WAS ENCASED IN

A POORLY LIGHTED CONTAINER IT SEEMED AND WAS OBLONG IN SHAPE,
