There is not much doubt that what was reported was seen but apparent cause of phenomenon could not be determined. Radar sites which covered this area, both GCI and Tower ASR, had no radar contact. The Allegheny Observatory was not operating during this period and could not verify the sighting or provide any additional data. The Donora Police were asked to investigate and verify the sighting. They wisually checked to the east and northeast from their interpretation of information received and may have missed the sighting which was south. - 1. Description of the object:
- a. UFOB appeared to be round in shape to the naked eye and triangular in shape through binoculars.
- b. Size was compared to the North Star or a little smaller than a dime held at arms length.
 - c. The object appeared to be yellow-white in color.
 - d. There was only one object in sight at any one time.
 - e. 1/A
- f. Bineculars showed the object to be triangular with a tail approximately 1/16 the size of the object midway on one leg. When fading from sight, while watching through binoculars, it appeared round and decreased to the size of a pinhead prior to disappearing. It would re-appear in reverse order.
- g. A reddish brown tail, 1/16 the size of the object, was noticed midway on one of the legs.

h. H/A

- i. The object moved in a clockwise rectangular pattern and appeared and disappeared approximately six (6) times while under observation. The movement was usually indicated by slight movement plus the disappearance and then re-appearance in a different location. Movement was checked by witness using re-appearance in a different location. Movement was checked by witness using a flagpole as a stationary reference point. The tail always appeared to the rear similar to a jet exhaust when flying a rectangular pattern and the nose or spex of two legs was pointed in the direction of movement.
 - 2. Description of course of object:
- a. Attention was attracted to the object because it would appear and then disappear from sight.
 - b. Approximately 40° angular elevation and 180° in direction.
 - c. Approximately 50° angular elevation and 190° in direction.
- d. Object moved approximately 10° down, 30° left, 10° up, and 30° right. This pattern was made three (3) times.
- e. Through binoculars the object would decrease in size triangularly, become round and then fade from sight when about the size of a pinhead. Respectance was in reverse order.
- f. The object was under observation for one (1) nour and thirty-five (35) minutes except for 15 minutes when clouds hid it from sight.

 - The sighting was made visually.
