



- 11. 2nd Lt. David R. Perdue, AO 3055962, Chief, Radar Intelligence. This officer was not able to question the observers due to the fact that they are stationed in the Seoul area. But description sounds similar to those describing a weather ballon, although we have no information that a ballon was in this area. Words used by observers such as "hovering, Settling" point to this possibility.
