

Dear Mrs. Godfrey:

I have recently learned that you observed a "flying saucer" last May on and reported this to the Air Force a few days later. Perhaps you are familiar with my book on the subject of flying saucers, published by the Harvard University Press. In any event, I am always interested in sightings, and try, if possible, to find a reasonable natural explanation for them. In most cases I have succeeded. I would appreciate it if you would send me just as much information as you possibly can. Times, directions, locations, sky, and so on.

From the character of your report, as repeated to me, I would judge that this might be an "inferior mirage" of the sky, seen against a roadway. If the saucer was of a silvery gray and seemed to move ahead of your car as driving, keeping the road, this is almost certainly the proper explanation. Many people have made similar reports.
