FLYING OBJECT-On Jan. 16 around noon a luminous round flying object was observed in the area of Litschau near the Czech border. The flying body came from Czechoslovak territory, crossed the border, and soared steeply upward at an immense speed emitting a hissing noise. It then circled and warished in the direction of the Czech border. Police assume that the object was a guided rocket, since neither its sound nor shape was similar to a plane's. Its speed was about three times as fast as that of the Czech jets which frequently cruise near the border. The object was observed for two minutes. (Vienna, NEUER KURIER, Jan. 17, 1959--A)
