THE 801ST AND 681ST ACWRONS WITH FPS-20, GROUND RADAR, WERE CHECKED TO SEE IF THIS SIGHTING WAS CONFIRMED ON THEIR SETS. THESE SQUADRONS WERE CARRYING THE TANKER AND MOMBER PLUS FRIENDLY FIGHTERS FROM GEIGER AFB, WASHINGTON IN THAT AREA DURING THE PERIOD OF SIGHTING.
