
By advised that on 26 August 1960, at approximately 1930 hours, he, his wife, and three children sighted an unidentified flying object from the yard of their home in Andover, Mass.

for approximately three minutes, at which time it descended at about a thirty degree angle from the original altitude of 35,000 feet to approximately 15,000 feet. It lost sight of the object at the latter altitude when it became obscured from view by a group of large trees thirty feet away.

approximately 300 miles per hour, or "the speed of a commercial passenger airplane." The object did not leave a vapor trail, did not make any sound, and did not have any markings which would identify it as a familiar object.
