


Dear Major Coleman:

Thank you for your letter of August 25 promising to advise us of the Air Force conclusion in the May 20 Tyndall AFB case.

Considering the location of the June 4 sighting, I assumed the Air Force would have other reports on the sighting. One witness whom you may wish to contact was Mrs.

Mrs. Blue Ridge Summit, Penna. She reported a cigar-shaped UFO accompanied by several smaller "satellite" objects, visible about ten minutes. At first all objects were motionless, then the smaller ones sped toward the large object and all of them were obscured by trees in the foreground. This was early afternoon, and the objects were visible in the NE sky.

We would also like to check on the conclusion for the March 29, 1961 sighting near Lemoore Naval Air Station, Hanford, California. According to press wire reports, several highway patrolman sighted a large bright light which rose upward and headed westward at high speed. A follow-up story quoted the AF as saying the object was a Thor missile fired from Vandenburg at 9:14 p.m. According to N.A.S.A. records the Discoverer XXII was not launched until the following day at 3:25 p.m. (EST.) Can you clarify this?

I have passed the information you forwarded in yours of August 28th to the Aerospace Technical Intelligence Center (Blue Ridge Summit sighting).


The March 29th sighting you refer to was probably a Thor Intermediate Range Ballistic Missile which was launched at 2114 Pacific Standard Time by a Royal Air Force team. A Discoverer was launched the following day. As you know the Thor is the booster for the Agena vehicle. The Discoverer is an Air Force program as well as the Thor IRBM, now deployed in England and manned by the RAF.

I hope this clarifies the situation.



- 3. If NORAD desires to explain Command Post procedures, then an answer to Mr. Allen's letter should come from that Headquarters.


