

l wish to report an unusual object in the sky over Overbrook, Philad, Penna Time 6;50, place, between City Line and Wynnefield on Bryn Mawr Avenue, Philad Penna. OCT 18, 1961

What My Helper and I seen in the sky, it was like a Comet, firery tail at the head of the tail was a red object, the object was NOT traveling up in the sky but as a plane would travel, the speed was slow. It was a Big object like I seen in 1912 the Hailey Comet, yet this object was soo close to the ground, something like we have never seen before. At 7 P.H it Baided into the sky, and that was all we seen of it.

I thought you would like to have this report and also to check with any object that the United States Government may have had in mind at that time if they have sent up any Misslie at that time, or not. No report have I heard from the Press on this matter, but what ever it was it was BIG and I have never seen anything like it but the Hailey comet in 1912.

What and I seem that evening, and seem it first, as we looked at the object it seems to us that in front was a Gondola or what I would call the piolet room, from what I also seem and seem was like a window in this Piolet room as I seem a light there, and a long tail, and what a tail, and silent, as we watched this in movement it was traveling very slow for about five minutes and then it gained speed and was out of sight fast.

As from above in any plane if you lit a match at dusk it would be seen from above, and no doubt if this was a Russia made skyrocket of some sort, the front of this object was red. 




