



- 2. It is suggested that Mr. The forwarded a copy of the DOD Fact Sheet and that the USAF position in regard to "flying saucers" be explained.
- 3. Request that a guestionairre be forwarded in order that a more complete account of his sighting of 27 September 1962 be obtained. Also, information as to how his estimations of speed and altitude were determined would be helpful in a more complete analysis. Based upon the very limited information presented in his letter, a tentative analysis would be a meteor sighting. Suggest Mr. Lesser contact Mount Wilson or Palomar observatories in the Los Angeles area for a possible correlation with other meteor sight-ings.
