A UFO was seen near Washington, D. C. on the night of February 6th by two men flying a private plane, and visual confirmation was made by another plane, though nothing showed up on Washington radar.

Williamsport, Pa., told reporters that he and another man with him saw the object for nearly an hour, while flying from Charlottsville, Va., to Washington. The UFO appeared off their right wing at a distance of several miles, and moved toward, under and above the aircraft. It hovered awhile, and later went about 75 miles in 5 seconds. The object seemed to have a ball-like shape, and estimated it to be about ten feet in diameter. The light from it was so bright that it cast a reflection on the plane...

NICAP-Jan-Feb 1963..... A strange fastmoving object flying near Washington D C was sighted on Feb 7 by Carl C Chambers, a Linden, Pa pillot and photographer, and John P Campbell, repurcer on the Williamsport Pa (Sun-Gazette). The FAA tower at Washington Airport said another pilot had confirmed the UFO sighting.

The UFO had a yellow-white glow, and was first seen at 5500: near Charlottesville, Va. At one time the object hovered off their right wing, then moved rapidly under and above them. A few minutes later it was seen 35 miles south of Washington, seemingly hovering over a defense-missile site. Half a minute later, the witness said it reappeared 10-15 miles north of the Gapital. (An indicated speed of over 5,000 mph) During the rest of the time the UFO was observed, it was estimated to be moving at about 2,000 knots,

February, 1963, special comments: I think that Case 2 must be Vega rather than Spica since the azimuth is listed as 55°, and Spica would be in the southeast, not the northeast. Reference to the handy dandy star map shows that Vega was just on the horizon at that time in the northeast. It is also a brighter star than Spica and probably accounted for the observation. I must chide the committee on this one; none of the three other members caught the discrepancy in azimuth. This will keep them on their toes! For the rest of February the committee and I seem to be in general agreement with you, except that, in general, we are less positive DR HYNEK'S EVALUATION in our identifications.
