Series of blue flashes spaced about 3 seconds apart observed to the right of overhead moving toward 3'o'clock and the right extrmeity of the horizon. About 15 or 20 flashes. Flashes similar to a flashbulb. No sound. Stars visible with scattered clouds. Flashes evenly spaced.

Check with WP Operations revealed that a T-33 from Minneapolis with Home Base at Maxwell landed at 2228 (0328z) and was over Xenia at the time in a normal landing pattern. No a/c was noted by the wit-

ness. Since the witness did not observe any other object it is assumed that this a/c is the cause of the report.

Assuming that right overhead was the center of a clock, the blue flashes moved progressively to the right toward the position of three o'clock. The flashing crossed the heavens from the center point (straight overhead) to the right extremity of the horizon (that is to the North)

Observer believes bright blue color rules out meteor and a/c. Flash was similar to that of flashbulb.






