CLOSE SAUCER SIGHTING IN MICHIGAN: Two deputy sheriffs in Port Huron, Michigan, had an unusual encounter with a UFO at about 5 a.m. last November 12th. They observed what was at first only a "flickering light" hovering in the sky. As it got closer, it seemed at times that there was a big divided window in the midst of the flashing light, but the officers could not be sure. The UFO eventually approached to a height of only a few hundred feet above the ground, a short distance from their patrol car. The deputies attempted to follow it, reaching speeds up to 75 miles per hour in the chase, but the object out-distanced them. They lost sight of it completely for awhile. It then reappeared, and the officers stopped the car, turned out their headlights, and

shined spotlights onto the object. They then turned on the flashing light on top of the patrol car, and in a few moments the UFO not only had a flashing white light but it also seemed to be flashing a red light back at them, as if in an attempt at communication! The UFO appeared to again be standing still in the sky at that time, and they could hear a low sound of motors. Suddenly the motors grew louder, and the object disappeared rapidly out of sight.
